AAUW throughout Northern Virginia is off to a tremendous start with programs, events and opportunities to fortify our mission to empower women and girls. Add to that the many social activities available to foster old and new friendships. Take comfort in that our Reston-Herndon Area Board has been busy over the summer to ensure that we are providing members a return on their investment in AAUW. As you read about upcoming events, you will note that there are many venues to engage, "give back", and be personally fulfilled. Before getting to upcoming events, let me offer a few personal perspectives.

When I became Branch President in 2015, I was feeling challenged to continue the momentum that had been established by past Co-Presidents, Cyndi Shanahan and Maureen Dwyer. They had reenergized the branch on so many levels with particular emphasis on Human Trafficking, partnerships with local non-profits, refocusing our scholarship efforts and bringing balanced business acumen to our efforts. To follow them was a daunting task. I would not have been able to undertake next steps without the help of Roberta Sherman who is our Branch VP. According to our bylaws she has oversight of all that goes on. And she has done that extremely well.

Through the volunteer commitment and passion of our members, I believe we have continued momentum and we have ventured onto new paths to add more impactful goals. Albeit that we suffered a loss with the passing of Bea Malone this summer, we are coordinating Monthly Programs through a committee. The same process is underway for Membership and Arts & Culture (formerly known as Cultural Diversity). If any member would like to serve on any of these committees, we welcome you with open arms.

In spite of our leadership vacancies, we have a strong program curriculum to offer over the next several months coupled with our on-going "institutions" such as Lobby Corps, GOTV, Great Decisions (now at two locations), Book Group, Mentoring (with a feasibility study for mentoring at Loudoun school), Adopt-a Spot aimed at local community "clean-up", and a new initiative to create a "STEAM Club" for 3rd grade girls at a local school. Additionally we are in the planning stages of a study series called "Safe Haven" that educates us on the signs of human trafficking in our communities and what steps we can take as ordinary citizens. We have so many opportunities to make a difference at the local level.

Due to the enthusiasm and dedication of Marilyn Silvey and Cynthia Hausdorff, we have a footprint in Ashby Ponds that boosts our Loudoun membership to 33 which is more than 30% of our overall membership. Cynthia recruited interested parties to establish a monthly Great Decisions group at Ashby Ponds that brought in 7 new members. We welcome all our Ashby Pond members and promise to bring more events to Loudoun. We look forward to recruiting more Loudoun members through the efforts of Garima Singh.

Thanks go out to Cyndi Shanahan who coordinated a women's clothing drive over the summer for Artemis House and to our members who made donations of: 15 pajamas; 30 pairs of underwear; 12 flip flops; and15 slippers.

We now have a member "Buddy" system in place that is geographically structured. Expect to hear from your personal "Buddy" periodically starting in October. The purpose is to ensure that all our members know about up-coming events and to encourage attendance. Plus it is a great way to stay "in touch". To
