Lobby Corps (LC) enthusiastically resumed activity on January 10 asking Members of the House to co-sponsor the Paycheck Fairness Act. There was new energy in the air as the 116th Congress began: newly elected members...new staff...and our renewed dedication to our mission, Equity-Equality-Education and Research to advance women.

On January 31, current and new members of regional LC met at AAUW HQ for a three hour training session. Approximately 50 attendees were inspired and updated with messages from Kim Churches, CEO; Deb Vagins, senior VP for Public Policy and Research; and Pam Yuen, Senior Government Relations Coordinator for Public Policy. Our branch is proud to have eight currently active members of LC.

February 7th marked a unique day of activism in Richmond. Two of our members joined forces with other AAUW branch members for a hard hitting Lobby Day solely to garner support for VA to be the 38th State to vote for the ERA. We were joined by coalition partners and not alone in our "ask". Unfortunately, it was not to be.

Our last two LC sessions were held at the House where we worked in pairs and asked Members (#96) to cosponsor acts that promote work-life balance (Healthy Families Act) and the Minimum Wage Act. Hopefully, YOU are part of the 2 Minute Activist and will support these endeavors from your computer or smart phone.

OneVA2021, the redistricting/Gerrymandering dismantling plan that AAUW VA Public Policy supports and endorses is moving forward.



On Feb 26, the House Education and Labor Committee approved the Paycheck Fairness Act. The committee approved one amendment with minor and technical changes and defeated several harmful amendments that would have undermined the goals of the legislation. The Paycheck Fairness Act remains strong and now advances to the House floor, where the full House of Representatives will vote on its passage. AAUW advocates ensured that Congress made this critical pay equity legislation a top priority, and we continue to advocate for swift passage of the Paycheck Fairness Act to help close the gender pay gap. Contact your members of Congress today and urge them to swiftly pass the Paycheck Fairness Act!
