2020 AAUW Virtual Convening

AAUW is excited to announce plans for a series of virtual events in 2020 that will mark the 100th anniversary of women's right to vote, inform our members and supporters in a critical presidential election year, and move us all closer to a fully fair future for women and girls. The various virtual programs will spotlight the work you and others are doing on behalf of AAUW to ensure women and girls everywhere have equal opportunities to learn, lead and earn the salaries they deserve. In January, we'll launch "A 2020 Vision for Equity," which will bring together a panel with leaders from politics, business and beyond to share their insights about the progress we've made in women's equity and the future of our movement. Although there will be no in-person national convention or major convening in 2020, we understand the importance of bringing women together to network and support AAUW and its mission-and our outreach will be designed with those goals in mind. AAUW's decision to focus on virtual events in lieu of an in-person convening was guided by the AAUW National Convening Task Force and approved by the board of directors. The task force conducted a rigorous review of conventions, conferences and other events on gender equity taking place around the nation, with the goal of finding options that would ensure that more members can participate. Less than 1 percent (734) of AAUW members attended our last National Convention in 2017. While these gatherings are a rich part of our legacy and a unique opportunity for networking, the Task Force evaluated ways to convene that could engage many more members and supporters in our mission to achieve gender equity and enable financial sustainability. All four of the most recent AAUW National Conventions have operated at a financial loss, and the deficits from the 2015 and 2017 meetings were substantial. The Task Force evaluated ways to convene members that would not pull resources away from our core work of creating lasting change for women and girls. We are looking forward to celebrating our progress in 2020 and working with you to ensure a future of equity for all.

Work Smart

The AAUW Work Smart Negotiation Program is free online for <u>anyone</u> looking to learn how to negotiate a salary increase or promotion. Share with everyone you know!

Work Smart is designed to show you:

- How to identify and articulate your personal value
- How to develop an arsenal of persuasive responses and other negotiation strategies including how to get a raise or promotion
- How to conduct objective market research to benchmark a target salary and benefits
- About the wage gap, including its long-term consequences

Why is negotiation so important? AAUW's research on the gender pay gap shows that, one year out of college, women are already paid significantly less than men. Women who work full time take home 80 cents for every dollar a full-time male worker is paid. And over a lifetime, those lost potential earnings add up.

Women who negotiate increase their potential to earn higher salaries and better benefits packages. By negotiating fair and equitable salaries, you'll be better able to pay off loans, buy the things you want and need, and even save for retirement.

In 2008, the Reston/Herndon Branch of AAUW revived the Branch Adopt A Spot Program and began to clean up the path and roadway along North Shore Drive, from the Uplands Pool to Wiehle Avenue. This path was chosen because it abuts Forest Edge Elementary School where our Branch Mentoring Program took place for many years.
