She has graciously agreed to remain active in the leadership of our branch and I will also be relying on our membership and our Board to keep our branch on track. Dianne and I attended the AAUW Virginia Leadership Conference in Harrisonburg in late July. Here are a few updates from the conference:

- Work Smart It remains critically important for all members, whether still employed or not, to take the WorkSmart online training before the end of August. Getting the numbers up will help build the required numbers for the Coca Cola grant. Other branches were very interested in our Work Smart leafleting campaign at the libraries and community centers and want to adopt it. - Membership Another statistic. Only 7.5% of AAUW members are under 60. Clearly this is a long-term problem for the organization.
- National Financial Issue Suzanne Rothwell did a good presentation and summary of Kim Church's webinar on the financial challenges facing the National organization. We will keep you updated on happenings and changes at National throughout the fall.
- Diversity Cyndi Shanahan of our branch is leading the AAUW VA diversity initiative. I
  was asked to speak on our Branch's diversity work. Kudos to Ilene Banker for her
  leadership in this area. Ilene has agreed to be our point of contact with Cyndi on the
  diversity initiative.
- Public Policy The AAUW VA Public Policy action plan will focus on pay equity including
  a state ban of salary history as a basis for compensation. This will be the focus of the
  January 15, 2020, Virginia state lobby day. Work to ratify the ERA will continue.
  Branches are encouraged to reach out to local delegates, meet with them and send

letters of congratulations to newly elected delegates. Please see the update from our Public Policy team.

- Alexandria has begun a very exciting initiative on Human Trafficking including developing an app to help rescue victims. Our Executive Committee has already voted to support Alexandria's grant request to National for money to develop their app. We need someone in the branch with a passion for this problem to be our point of contact on Human Trafficking.
- Finally, National has developed an exciting program to recognize Five Star branches.
   We'll discuss this more at our Executive Committee and Board meetings and update the membership once we have more details and an action plan. #### Public Policy - Mary Zane and Judi Polizzotti Co-Chairs

We are looking forward to a successful year full of actions to meet our goals and learning about the issues and challenges. The following are the items we will be focusing on:

- Pay Equity On the state level, we will support the effort to ban salary history as a basis for compensation.
- Work Smart Our first priority will be to have as many members as possible take the AAUW Work SmartOnline Training Program. This will help us get a grant from Coca Cola. Here's the link. https://courses.aauw.org/learn/signin
- Support Voting Outreach Efforts in this Off Year Election All 40 Senate Seats and 100 seats in the House of Delegate are up for reelection in addition to some local offices. We will be supporting efforts to hold debates and get out the vote and voter guides.
- ERA Even though last year's vote was disappointing, we will continue to support ratifying the ERA.
- OneVA2021 Gerrymandering continues to be an important issue, especially as our elections proceed. We will continue to support efforts to end gerrymandering in VA prior to the next census.

Lobby Corps -As described in an email from our previous Branch President Dianne Mero and current President Janine Greenwood, AAUW National is experiencing financial difficulties into the 2020 fiscal year and beyond which will affect the national organization. They will have an impact on our interactions with National. As a result, there were personnel reductions in the Public Policy Staff that effect Lobby Corps. We have met in June and July but not on a weekly basis when Congress is in session as before. Per Senior VP Public Policy and Research, Deborah Vagins, "Staff will be working with the Lobby Corps leadership and its working group to develop the schedule for the remainder of the calendar year, with the goal of visiting Congressional offices at least once a month when Congress is in session." This will be updated as soon as the schedule becomes available. The board emphasized that Lobby Corps will continue. Federal Lobby Day is now scheduled for October 17.
