The Board has been busy not only with wonderful programming, but also making plans for the remainder of the year. Additionally, other members have come up with and are making great things happen. Here is just a little of what has already happened this fall and what is planned in the future:

- We have actively worked on public policy issues.
 - We are members of a coalition led by the League of Women Voters and call on the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors to support the CEDAW human rights resolution for gender equity. CEDAW is the UN Convention for the Elimination of all forms of Discrimination Against Women.
 - Many of you wrote Reclaim Our Vote postcards to encourage voting in support of our state wide efforts.
 - Plan on joining in lobbying at the state level this winter! It is a blast, and always thrilling to see our sister members from across the state and our state wide representatives!
- We have taken on two significant educational equity initiatives:
 - Increased scholarship support at Northern Virginia Community College.
 - Developed an inclusion essay program for South Lakes and Herndon High Schools based on a program developed by Springfield/Annandale branch. We submitted and were awarded a mini-grant to partially fund this program. This program will be coming up in the spring – so look for more information to come!
- We held branch level programs as well as group gatherings for Book Group, Streaming Group and Great Decisions. Even though we see you through a screen it is great that some many of our members are able to participate in these programs in the comfort of their own home!
- At the branch administration level we are:
 - submitting appropriate paperwork to ensure we continue with our 5-star designation. We all feel that we are well situated to gain this recognition again!

- starting a succession planning process to ensure branch leadership is strong in the future. If you are interested in participating or being a part of the leadership team, please reach out to either of us – we'd love to have you help lead our branch in whatever way works best for you.
- continuing our focus on connections and relationships with NCNW and League of Women Voters. The Presidents of each group have been awarded free membership in our organization.
- coordinating small lunch groups to ensure we stay connected.

November 2 is Election Day!! Here are some tips as you go off to vote:

- Absentee **ballots submitted by mail** must be **postmarked November 2 or earlier and received by noon on November 5**.
- Absentee **ballots submitted in person** must be received **by 7 p.m. on Election Day, November 2.**
- Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day for those who have not early voted.
- Curbside assistance is available for voters 65 years and older and those with a physical disability. Park in the assigned spot and follow the directions on the sign. It may be helpful to have someone along who can go inside and find an election officer to help. They will bring a ballot to the car and seal it after you complete it.
- Encourage your friends and family to vote and offer assistance if they need it.

Spread the word about voting: "When women vote, they change the conversation."
