**AAUW Statement Strongly Condemning the U.S. Supreme Court's Opinion
on *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization***

The American Association of University Women (AAUW) strongly condemns the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*. The decision overturns the landmark *Roe v. Wade* ruling that established abortion as a constitutionally protected right nearly 50 years ago and ignores the will of the American people, 80% of whom support legal abortion.

AAUW believes everyone has the right to make decisions about their own reproductive lives without government interference. Abortion access is vital to women's ability to control their lives, bodies and futures. Without reproductive freedom, there can be no equity.

Being able to choose whether and when to become a parent improves women's well-being and fosters economic security—a crucial component of AAUW's mission. This is particularly important in a country that lacks accessible maternal health care, paid caregiving leave and workplace protections for pregnant workers.

The Court's decision hurts all of us, but it will do the most harm to low-income people, women of color, immigrants, people with disabilities and LGBTQ+ people, because these groups already face substantial barriers to accessing reproductive services and health care.

While the Court's decision is a major setback for all Americans, AAUW remains steadfast in our commitment to protecting reproductive rights, a vital component of gender equity.



PROGRAMS - Janine Greenwood, VP Programs

We had a wonderful time getting back together for our annual meeting at Lake Anne. It was great to reconnect in person.

We have two programs this summer featuring local history. On **Thursday July 28 at 10AM** we will meet at the Reston Museum at Lake Anne. Step back in time and join us for a guided **historic walking tour exploring Reston's founding**. Tour starts at the Reston Museum and lasts approximately 30 minutes. We will then have a private view of the museum's new exhibit **Determined: The 400-Year Struggle for Black Equality**. The exhibit traces four centuries of Black history in Virginia through stories of extraordinary individuals who struggled for equality and, in the process, profoundly shaped the nature of American society and the meaning of our collective ideals. Let's meet for lunch after the tour and discuss what we learned.

We will try our first hybrid meeting on **August 30 at 2PM** and will hear from Barbara Glakas the **Historian of the Herndon Historical Society** on notable women in the history of Herndon. It will be great to learn more about our local foremothers. A hybrid meeting means we will be both live at the Reston Government Center and online with Zoom at the same time. This format may not work for some other meetings, but we are looking forward to experimenting. We hope to see many of you in person and ask those online to be patient with any technical challenges.

At both meetings, we also hope you will bring a donation for the food pantry at the Loudoun Campus of NOVA Community College. Food insecurity for students is a growing problem, particularly with rising prices. A list of suggested items will be provided before the meeting.

We are working on a number of fall programs and are particularly excited about a September program on Unconscious Bias featuring Patty Hagan.
